
OPEN RACES ARE OFTEN STARTED BEFORE THE CLUB. A CLASS FLAG IS USED TO SIGNAL THEIR 5:4:1:START SEQUENCE, IN THIS CASE A "V" FLAG THE START OF THE CLASS **BECOMES THE 5 MINUTE** WARNING FOR THE CLUB RACE, THE FLAGS SWAPPED AND THE NEXT 5:4:1:START **SEQUENCE** Where two classes are racing their course can be shortened independently of each other by raising the 'S' below their class flag RACES MAY BE **POSTPONED**,

SIGNALLED BY FLAG AND TWO **BLASTS AND RACERS** ADVISED IN THE CLUBHOUSE



RACING MAY BE ABANDONED - SIGNALLED BY FLAG AND THREE BLASTS





Other clubs and races may use refinements of signals to show the length of postponement, class flag sequences, countdown etc - these are given in the pre-race briefing. This is not a definitive list but normal practise at WSC

DISPLAYING THE COURSE

ROUNDING MARKS ARE DISPLAYED EITHER ON THE BOARD OF THE START HUT OR THE COMMITTEE BOAT, LEFT TO RIGHT, THEN NUMBER OF LAPS
