### **1. Organising Authority**

The organising authority is Whitefriars Sailing Club.

#### 2. Rules

2.1 All races will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing 2021-2025.

2.2 Competitors should note that Whitefriars Sailing Club implements the RYA Racing Charter and that they will be required to undertake to sail in compliance with the Charter, which can be found at the front of the RYA rule book (RYA Racing Rules of Sailing 2021-2025).

2.4 Whitefriars sailing club operates a no smoking policy in the club house and compound which must be observed at all times.

2.5 Whitefriars Sailing Club rules state that dogs, brought on site, must be kept on a lead at all times, must not cause a nuisance and are not allowed in the Clubhouse.

2.6 Whitefriars Sailing Club requires that all children under the age of 10 must wear buoyancy aids whilst at the club unless inside the Clubhouse. Children under the age of 16 must be supervised by an adult at all times.

# 3. Conditions of sailing and racing

3.1a The Inland Championship is for Albacores. Entries by eligible boats should be made on the appropriate form in the clubhouse or on the internet at https://.

The entry fee for the event will be £30. Registration by internet is recommended but in-person registration will commence from 11.00 Sat 23<sup>rd</sup> October 2021 at the Whitefriars clubhouse.

3.1b Entry fee includes bacon roll and hot drinks on Saturday and Sunday mornings.

3.1c There a hot meal available on Saturday evening for  $\pm 10$  per person. Please pay in advance at https://

3.1d All helms must be a member of the National Albacore Association. Whitefriars Sailing Club members can enter the event by paying temporary membership to NAA for £5 for the weekend.

3.2 All craft on the club premises (on land and on the water) must have full insurance cover, including third party liability to  $\pm 3,000,000$ . All craft intended to be used for racing must include use for racing in their insurance cover.

3.3 The safety of the participant's boat and its entire management including insurance shall be the sole responsibility of the competitor(s) racing the boat.

3.4 The event organisers shall not be liable for any loss, damage, death or personal injury howsoever caused to the owner/competitor, his skipper or crew, as a result of their taking part in the race or races. Moreover, every owner/competitor warrants the suitability of his craft for the race or races.

3.5 In order to prevent the spread of non-native species there is a requirement to ensure that boats are clean before they visit the site using the principle of Check – Clean- Dry. See http://www.nonnativespecies.org/checkcleandry/index.cfm.

### 4. Event and Programme

4.1 Whitefriars Sailing Club will be open to receive visiting competitors from 9 am on the Saturday 23<sup>rd</sup> October 2021. Can be available on evening of Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> October by arrangement.

4.2 There will be a briefing for all competitors no earlier than 12.00 on Saturday  $23^{rd}$  October 2021.

4.3 It is intended there will be 6 races. The warning signal for the first race shall be no earlier than 13.00 on Saturday  $23^{rd}$  October 2021.

4.4 Hot and cold drinks will be available throughout both days. Camping is available by the lakeside and there are facilities for tents, caravans and motorhomes.

4.5 The race starting sequence shall be as defined in the Whitefriars 'Sailing Instructions for Open Meetings'

#### 5. Sailing Instructions

Sailing instructions will be available at registration on the day of the event, on the internet on https://whitefriarssc.org/albacore and are posted on the official race notice board in the clubhouse.

# 6. Course

The course will be set on Whitefriars Sailing Club water. The course will be posted on the committee boat and/or race hut.

#### 7. Scoring

The number of results that will be used to determine a boats series score will be as follows:-

6 races completed, 5 results will count

5 races completed, 4 results will count

4 races completed, 3 results will count

3 races completed, 3 results will count

2 races completed, 2 results to count. A minimum of 2 races will constitute a series.

### 8. Personal Buoyancy Flotation Devices

Adequate personal flotation devices for crew members shall be worn at all times. Wet suits and dry suits are not personal flotation devices. Rule 40.1 applies.
